Reno, Nevada holds the title of "The Biggest Little City in the World" and is nestled on the eastern slope of the Sierra Nevada Mountains in the Truckee Meadows (aka Reno–Tahoe-Fernley CSA area). Reno is one of the most populous metropolitan areas in the entire state with a population over 250,000.
